

Chat Central is a National Lottery Funded project where we help people to find others with similar interests, to have fun, get out of the house, join in with a hobby, get involved with their community and to find new friends, tackling loneliness and isolation in all its forms in Coventry.

We help people to explore their interests and start doing the things they want to do. Our support is tailored to the person's needs and can be anything from a one-off visit to us for information to longer term support. We have a range of activities including welcome sessions, walks, arts and crafts, yoga, pool, bingo, group volunteering and health talks. Our aim is to reach-out and help anyone in Coventry who is 18 and over, especially if they are bereaved, retired, a new parent, just out of hospital, dealing with an illness or condition that limits their ability to get out, recently arrived in the city or just out of practice with socialising. Our 'Give it a Go Thursdays' offer the perfect opportunity to try or learn something new in a friendly, supportive and relaxed environment. We meet every other Thursday at the United Reformed Church Hall between 2:00 and 4:00 and there's always the chance for a catch up and a cuppa too. Mandy's 'Dance Energise' session made everyone feel great as we moved, shook maracas and sang along to lots of uplifting tunes. We welcomed Warwickshire Wildlife Trust who told us all about the Sherbourne Vally Project and ways in which to volunteer with them, as well as making seed bombs and bird feeders. We've also enjoyed sessions led by our own volunteers. John led a songwriting session in which he shared his musical knowledge and supported participants to write and record a song. We look forward to hearing the completed track at the next songwriting session on Thursday 5th September. We also welcomed back Linda who led a wonderful 'Doodle Power' session which provided a creative and relaxing afternoon. Wellbeing Walks and Mindfulness

We practiced mindful eating and breathing and were encouraged to use all of our senses to appreciate the flowers that Jane had brought in for us to enjoy.

We also joined the EnV team on some Wellbeing Talks and Walks in which we talked in small groups about being more active and connected. The event in the War Memorial Park concluded with a senses walk in the Peace Garden, whist at the second event participants set personal wellness goals. Chat Central also led walks following the city's Peace Trail and to the Charterhouse Heritage Park and River Sherbourne.

Connecting to Coventry

Chat Central were delighted to welcome Scott Duffin, local historian and author of 'Elephants of Coventry,' to speak about the creation of his book and his passion for Coventry. He shared with participants, his story of embarking on an elephant hunt to produce a record of the hundreds of elephants across the city, including those found on buildings, bottles and bollards.

His knowledge of the city's history was evident as he proudly passed around various objects from his, 'Coventry Collection' with coins, cups and medals dating back hundreds of years. One participant said, "I loved the elephants of Coventry talk. Not only because I learnt so much about the significance that the Elephant has, and about the numerous elephant representations around the city, but also because Scott's passion for Coventry's history was so infectious that it's given me a whole new way of looking and thinking as I walk around the city. Thank you, Scott, and thank you Chat Central."



Neil Catley also joined us to share his story of how taking up photography helped him when he was anxious and unable to leave the house. Neil has attracted the attention of many with his beautiful images of Coventry and has set up his own group, 'Confidence Through Photography,' which aims to help those with mental health issues to meet up with others, develop their creative skills and build confidence. Following a talk, which show cased his work, Neil led the Chat Central group on a walk around the city, offering tips and advice as we photographed historic buildings and landmarks.



Chat Central enjoyed the Peace Picnic at Coventry's Peace Orchard to commemorate 80 years since the D-Day Landings. A time to reflect and say thank you to those who have died for peace. We were entertained by Vintage Celine Rose, Christopher Sidwell and the students from Cardinal Newman School. Later, Chat Central spent time exploring the orchard with Lady Godiva.

Mission Possible: Clothing Coventry

Chat Central encourages participants to take part in group volunteering sessions to see what volunteering roles are available throughout the city. In May, we visited the city's clothing bank in Hillfields, Clothing Coventry, to help sort bags of donations. Our participants worked alongside other volunteers checking clothes and organising items into sizes and sections which can then be given out. As a result of this group volunteering experience, Michael is now a regular volunteer with Clothing Coventry and a valued member of the team there.



Taster Sessions in Tennis and Bowls

Chat Central always aims to introduce participants to groups and clubs with affordable opportunities that they can go on to attend independently. In July, we visited The Avenue Bowls Club in Coundon for a taster session. For many of us it was our first time playing bowls, but we soon got into the swing of things. As with all Chat Central events, the sessions were free, and all equipment was provided. Everyone at the club was incredibly welcoming and shared their knowledge of the sport with us along with a chat over coffee and cake in the club house afterwards. One participant has been back for additional taster sessions with the club and plans to join them. Mark told us, "It is good exercise, and I have really enjoyed myself. Also, it is an opportunity to meet new people."





Chat Central also took participants to Spencer Park for a series of tennis sessions. Our wonderful coach Collen offered words of advice and encouragement as we practised our rallies and serves. It was lots of fun and many of the participants are planning to return. Poornima said, "It was not just a tennis session for me. It made me come out of the house. I was feeling lonely at home and was not participating in other gatherings, but tennis is my passion. It dragged me to come out of loneliness. Thank you so much for this opportunity."

Underground Lights Show and Open Mic at St. Mary's Guildhall

Canoeing on Coventry Canal


